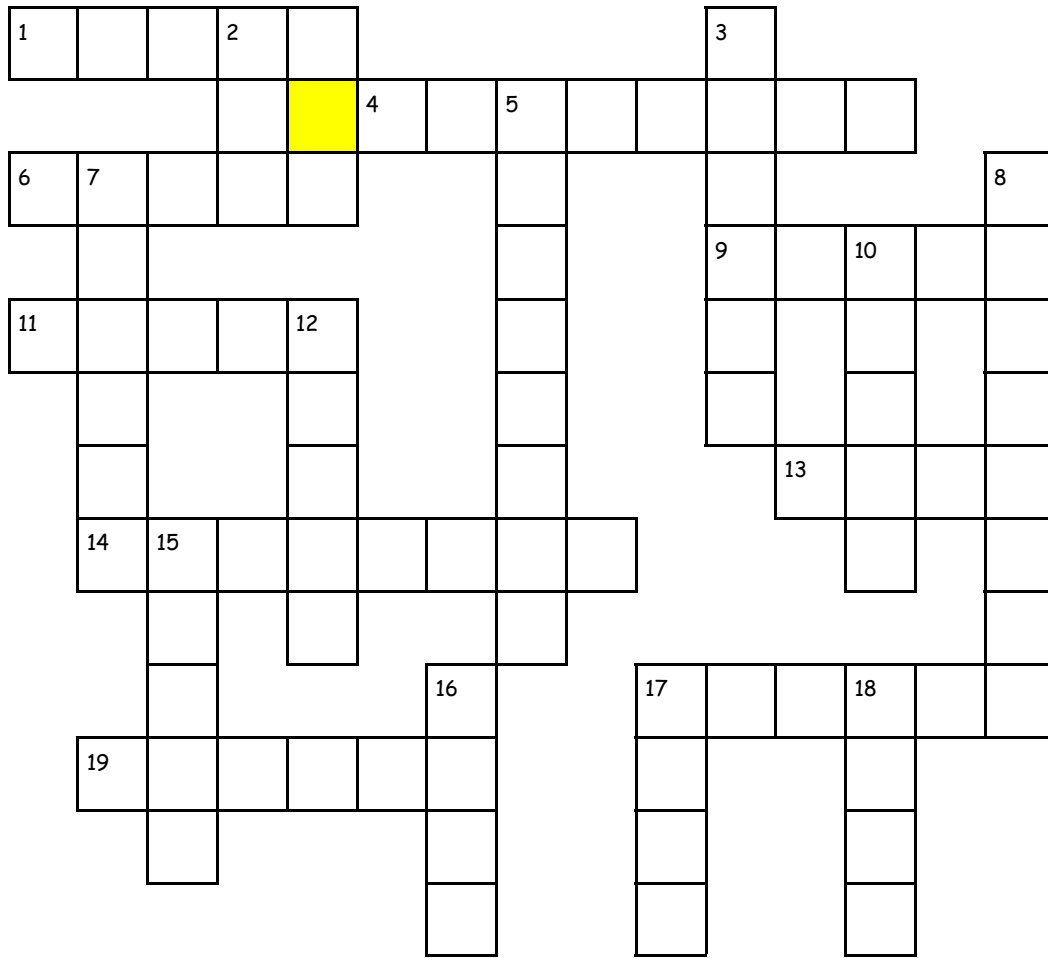

Everyone has responsibilities make sure you fulfil yours .

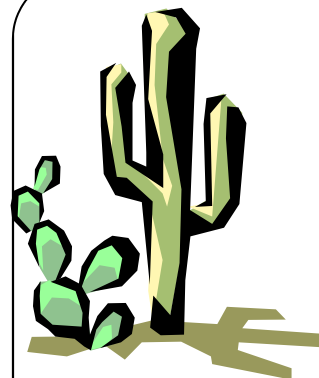

When Bilal's master found out about him becoming a Muslim, he became mad with rage and anger. He punished Bilal very severely and ordered him to leave Islam.



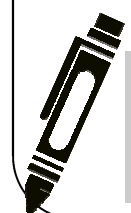

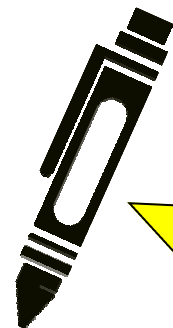
